8.1.[POLICY] OPPOSITION TO COUNCIL FILE 11-1020-S3 - Discussion and possible action opposing Council File 11-1020-S3 which substitutes "Budget Advocates" for "budget advocacy" in the Los Angeles Municipal Code thereby removing the ability for neighborhood councils to support the independent-NC-elected watchdog organization called Budget Advocates. — *Moved by Marton, seconded by Ruesch; approved without objection.*

8.2.[FUNDING][PLUM] 3871 GRAND VIEW DEVELOPMENT DOOR HANGERS & DISTRIBUTION - Discussion and possible action regarding an expenditure, not to exceed \$2,400, to purchase and distribute 10,000 door hangers regarding the development at 3871 Grand View Blvd. — *Motion to amend language to "The MVCC approves an expenditure, not to exceed \$600, for the costs related to printing and distributing 1,000 PLUM door hangers for the August 2, 2022, PLUM meeting to notify stakeholders of the proposed development at 3871 S. Grand View Blvd." Motion to amend made by Wheeler; Amendment failed without a second. Original motion made by Ruesch, seconded by Samiley; approved 3 to 1 (Wheeler).*

If there are any broadcasting interruptions that prevent the public from observing or hearing the meeting, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned. If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned.

In conformity with the September 16, 2021 enactment of California Assembly Bill 361 (Rivas) and due to concerns over COVID-19, the Mar Vista Community Council meeting will be conducted entirely with a call-in option or internet-based service option.

Every person wishing to address the Board must either use the Zoom link (at the top of this agenda) or dial the phone number (at the top of this agenda) and enter the Meeting ID number (at the top of this agenda) and then press # to join the meeting. When prompted by the presiding officer for public input at the Neighborhood Council meeting, the public will be requested to use the Raise Hand option or dial *9 (for phone) to address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered.
