2. Public Comment for items not on this agenda

- Jordan Le Blanc (Stakeholder Status Unknown): LAUSD and UCLA Youth Source, actively recruiting youth ages 14 and 24. This is paid work experience through UCLA Youth Source. It is 120 hours paid work experience at \$15hr. It is an extension of the Community Based Learning Department. Fields of work vary. This is a year round program that includes workforce development, soft skills and wrap around services.
 - The requirements are an LA City Address and to be a youth that is low income, foster youth system involved.
- Ashley Zeldin (Mar Vista Stakeholder): Shared the idea of a fairy garden in the community, inspired by a story on Twitter. Palms Fairy garden reached out.

- Kalani W (Mar Vista Stakeholder): Suggested temporary murals (like at Bowler and the Mar Vista) on boarded up buildings to uplift the community. "Art inspires hope." Based on Palms electrical boxes it could cost between \$250 and \$500 for a mural.

- Jorce Dara (West LA Community of Schools, Mar Vista Stakeholder):
 - Host town halls once a month, open to all
 - The goal is to move resources and decision-making to local communities to better serve the unique needs of local communities, students. Equitable instruction. Believe in unity, team work, and collaboration.
 - There is currently 1 high school, 18 principles
- Meaghan Bell (West LA Community of Schools, Mar Vista Stakeholder):
 - Richland Elementary School: Proud to Me contest winner, 305 students, k-5 only dual language french immersion, expanding to 6th grant. Registration required, tour January 21st
 - Webster Middle School & TEAM Magnet: 521 students, grades 6-8, LAUSD application, partners with AMGEN, UCLA
 - Reopening updates online learning will remain an option, hybrid will be developed
 - Closure effective December 10 that also affected IEP closed, staff, and beyond the bell

 - Pamula Solar (Vice Chair): Shared positively about her own children's experiences at these schools.
 - Dana Christensen (Second Vice Chair): How are students accepted?
 - Response: We participate in Choices for applying for school out of your district. We have 11-12 charters through Choices and those are a is lottery system. The residential schools have sheltered spots for neighborhood students in Magnet program.
 - Michelle Krupkin (Zone 5 Director): How do you determine criteria for ioining as a school?
 - Response: LAUSD is divided into areas. Within West LA broken down into communities of schools. The criteria is the feeder highschool.
 - David Lee (Mar Vista Stakeholder): COSA is new, thank you the presentation was helpful to understand. Would love to see collaboration for West LA and Venice COSAs, (such as) West LA collation for collaboration, no head butting.
 - Kalani W (Mar Vista Stakeholder): How closely are your guidelines based on charter guidelines? Are you a charter school? What is STEAM program? I have concerns about school scores.
 - Response: Joyce Dara (West LA Community of Schools, Mar Vista Stakeholder): We are part of LAUSD and have affiliated charters, not independent charter schools. These have discretion of curriculum but not over enrollment.
 - STEAM = Science Technology Art Engineering Math
 - Melissa Aczon, David Lee & Kalani W (Mar Vista Stakeholders): All shared the value of inclusive curriculum and art education.

- Ashley Zeldin (Mar Vista Stakeholder): As someone in tech and games, I love the incorporation of arts. Do you have a specific arts interest?
 - Response: Meaghan Bell (West LA Community of Schools, Mar Vista Stakeholder): It varies on school site. Dr. Reyes who is magnet coordinator.
 - David Lee (Mar Vista Stakeholder): Mr. Barrett is a great music teacher
 - Pamula Solar (Vice Chair): The arts curriculum switchs back and forth.
- Gabriel Hill (Chair): What is it that we can help you with?
 - Response: Meaghan Bell (West LA Community of Schools, Mar Vista Stakeholder): We can connect with the principle, if they are interested beyond school scope and connect with other systems of support for other communities of schools.
 - Joyce Dara (West LA Community of Schools, Mar Vista Stakeholder): We are looking for opportunities for relationships and support for schools. We love the idea of connecting as it benefits the community, families, and matriculation. We can be flexible especially during these times. For our kids.
