## Please describe the purpose and intent of this grant

The mission of Westchester Playa Village (WPV) is to help older adults remain active and independent in the comfort and security of their own homes so they may remain engaged in the neighborhoods they love, for as long as possible. We utilize the talents of volunteers to assist nearly 100 members in their daily activities and currently provide over 400 services a month. Our objectives align with the mission of the Aging in Place Committee of the Mar Vista Community Council. Through collaboration and outreach, WPV strengthens communities and promotes "neighbors helping neighbors". Because of our success in our current service area (Westchester, Playa Del Rey, and Playa Vista) we seek to expand our services to Mar Vista. We expect to build relationships with local businesses and other community organizations such as the Mar Vista Recreation Center, Venice High School, other schools and clubs to create a synergy that benefits the Mar Vista community. Through sound leadership and strategic growth, WPV is poised to bring our expertise to the Mar Vista community.

Mar Vista has close to 5000 residents who are 65 years old and over. This population represents 12.5% of the total Mar Vista community. (Los Angeles Almanac) It is important to note that the number of older adults aged 60 and older in the City of Los Angeles will be increasing rapidly over the next 5 years. The California Department of Aging cites that the population over 85 will also rapidly expand by 2020, reflecting the fact that we are living longer. Our services are particularly important for this special group especially in the areas of transportation and social programs.

Westchester Playa Village is requesting funding of **\$1500.00** to help defray the costs of a multifaceted outreach program to help facilitate our expansion into Mar Vista. With this grant, WPV will inform this select population of the benefits of becoming a member of Westchester Playa Village. The first phase will be to send a postcard to a targeted mailing list educating the recipient of our services and volunteer opportunities. This postcard will also invite the resident to our information sessions. Our second phase is to host 2 information sessions in Mar Vista. We will advertise these sessions in the local paper. Funds would go towards:

- printing of 4x6 postcard
- postage
- rental of a targeted mailing list for the 90066 zip code
- cost of ad for information session
- collateral material for 2 information session
- refreshments for 2 information sessions

Over the past few years, WPV has established a reputation for providing an excellent service for our members. As shown in a current study (2015) conducted by UC Berkeley, School of Social Welfare, WPV has earned the distinction of 99% of our members surveyed reporting, "being very satisfied or extremely satisfied" with the services and programs provided by WPV.

## How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at large?

Westchester Playa Village is a member of the Village-to-Village Network. Our goal is to maintain and improve the quality of life of our members. Something as simple as driving a neighbor to the doctor or clearing a walkway of debris can dramatically improve the quality of lives of older adults. According to the 2012 American Community Survey, the vast majority of older adults live independently including those 85 and older. Not surprisingly, most older adults want to live in their homes for as long as possible (AARP 2010). The assistance WPV provides enables these older adults to remain autonomous and keeps them connected to their community.

WPV also provides social opportunities for our members. Remaining socially active and engaged in the community is crucial to the health and well being of older adults. As an example, WPV

collaborates with the Westchester Senior Center, Loyola Marymount University, UCLA and other experts to offer quality seminars, classes and social events. We regularly offer seminars on topics such as Memory Training, Caregiver Support, Balance/Mobility, and Technology Training. Our most recent social event was a trip to the Skirball Cultural Center, which included a tour, lunch and transportation, free of charge.

In addition to providing needed social programs for older adults, WPV also offers opportunities to residents who wish to donate their time to help us achieve our mission. We have a very flexible volunteer program with a wide array of volunteer opportunities. Driving is our greatest need. Volunteer drivers take our members to/from medical appointments, help with grocery shopping, and provide transportation to other important activities to keep members active and engaged. Volunteers can pick and choose assignments based on their availability/schedule. WPV welcomes volunteers of all ages. For example, middle and high school students assist our members by getting trash bins to/from the curb each week, helping with yard work, providing personalized computer training, and companionship. These intergenerational connections help foster a sense of increased connection to residents of the community and appreciation for older adults. Our members also volunteer which contributes to a more vibrant social life and greater feelings of self-worth.

Westchester Playa Village plays an important role in our community. We foster community-minded living, volunteerism and pride in our neighborhoods. We help address the changing landscape of aging and provide solutions to the challenges older adults and their families face every day.
