- 7. **New Business:** TIME SENSITIVE. Public comment permitted (limit 1 min each)
 - a. Planning and Land Use Management Committee-Steve Wallace & Michael Millman, Co-Chairs
 - i. POLICY MOTION: AA-2012-3560-PMIA-SL 3621 Centinela Avenue small lot subdivision: Motion to oppose requiring street widening as a condition of this project. Approved 7-0-0 at MVCC PLUM. Project supported by MVCC previously.
 - ii. POLICY MOTION: 3960 GRAND VIEW BLVD: Motion to support proposed project: Zone Change from M1 to (TQ)(Q)R4-1 to allow a 51 Unit Market Rate Senior Citizen Residential Development with a building height up to 62 feet with onsite parking and 7,597 feet of open space. Motion to support the project as presented in MVCC PLUM: 6 aye, 3 nay, 0 abstaining. Minority report required.
 - b. DIRECTOR'S REQUEST: ZONE 4 MICHAEL MILLMAN: POLICY MOTION: PEPY'S GALLEY
 - i. In the matter of the pending eviction of Pepy's Galley from the Mar Vista Lanes bowling alley premises, the Mar Vista Community Council recognizes the new owners of the Mar Vista Lanes, Bowlmor AMF, cannot be legally required to keep Pepy's Galley. However, the Mar Vista Community Council also notes the considerable outpouring of neighborhood support to retain Pepy's in the community at that location. Therefore, the Mar Vista Community Council strongly encourages all good faith efforts between the new property owners, CD11, and Pepy's Galley to reach a compromise up to, and including, retaining the restaurant onsite in some reasonable form and/or provide more time for Pepy's owner to judiciously pursue relocation opportunities in the area.
 - c. DIRECTOR'S REQUEST: ZONE 1 DIRECTOR KEN ALPERN: POLICY MOTION: CAMPERS:
 - i. Whereas, the Mar Vista Community Council has always supported the Exposition Light Rail Line, walkable streets, improved bus and bicycle transportation, proper enforcement of zoning and building/safety laws, and elimination of urban blight, AND Whereas, there is an illegal accumulation of oversized campers and recreational vehicles being utilized as residences along Sepulveda Blvd. and other nearby thoroughfares in violation of L.A. Municipal Code, including, but not limited to: Section 80.73.2 (prohibiting the parking of vehicles "for 72 or more consecutive hours") and Section 85.01 (prohibiting the "dismantle" or "repair" of vehicles on public streets). These oversized vehicles cause a potential hazard to

passing motorists, buses, bicyclists and pedestrians, risk causing reduced mobility (including access to the Expo Line), are a potential source of criminal activity and are a source of urban blight, AND

Whereas, the City and the LAPD have as of yet been unable to eliminate this illegal and inappropriate accumulation of vehicles being utilized for residential purposes, Therefore, the Mar Vista Community Council (with the understanding that the Expo Line and the City's Complete Streets program are both coming very soon to the Westside) demands that implementation of signage and enforcement of all appropriate City laws, and with utilization of all available City resources, be immediately prioritized to remove this accumulation of vehicles and eliminate any precedent of such illegal/inappropriate activity on Sepulveda Blvd. and any other nearby thoroughfares.
