- e. Treasurer-William Scheding: NOTE: All funding motions must conform to all Empower funding guidelines and must be funded and paid in fiscal year 2013-14 or they will expire. All NPG and CIG grants approved by the Mar Vista Community Council are restricted funds according to Department of Neighborhood Empowerment regulations and must be used for the exact purpose approved by the MVCC.  - i. **FUNDING MOTION:** APPROVAL of NOVEMBER 2013 US Bank Card Statement **Motion approved unanimously.**
 - ii. **FUNDING MOTION:** APPROVAL of NOVEMBER 2013 Monthly Reconciliation Form **Motion approved unanimously.**
 - iii. **FUNDING MOTION: T&I/PLUM: LIBRARY/POST OFFICE ALLEY REPAVING: INGLEWOOD TO CENTINELA:** Whereas, the MVCC Board of Directors has prioritized the reconstruction and repair of the alley south of, and parallel to, Venice Blvd. between Inglewood and Centinela as the most important public works project within the MVCC, and Whereas, the CD11 office has received a bid for \$42,000 to perform this public works project, Therefore, the MVCC Board of Directors authorizes an initial budgeting of \$5000: \$2500 \$2400 from budget category 300 Community Improvement Grants and \$2500 \$2600 from budget category 400 Neighborhood Purposes Grants (with the possibility of further budgetary assignments) to be assigned to a fund held by the non-profit 501(c)3 corporation of the Venice Blvd. Streetscape Association, to which public and private donations would be encouraged for the greater community to donate to this effort, and The MVCC Board of Directors commits to working with the CD11 office and all governmental and private sources to reach the full \$42,000 necessary to achieve this overdue public works project to serve the needs of the greater Mar Vista community." Passed in committee 4 aye; 0 nay; one recused

Friendly amendment (see above) approved. Bill Koontz concerned with from where the remainder of the money will come to justify tying up this money. Ken Alpern suggest we see this going nowhere (say in six months) we could put the money back into play. Sharon Commins explains that a 501(c)3 would have to return the money if not used for the express purpose but worries that the money would be returned to LA instead to MVCC. Len will make it clear that we have committed money to this.

Motion carries unanimously.

- f. Mar Vista Bi Monthly LADOT/CD11/LAPD Traffic Committee Liaison Linda Guagliano -Linda: Backlog of painting of lines, signs etc. which have been approved getting installed. Some particular types of projects that haven't been considered for the last couple years are beginning to surface again.
- g. DWP MOU/LANCC Liaison-Bill Koontz
 -DWP MOU: 5 year integrated power source plan was presented and discussed. Water plans were also discussed. City wants "the one water plan" that would include stakeholder buy-in. Some board members visited Orange County water treatment facility and looking at something like this for LA. Rate increases discussed in January will probably be divided up into 4 year smaller increments. Sharon Commins was mentioned in regard to Recode LA. Collecting outstanding debts seems to be a major problem (into millions). City absorbs a great deal of the cost of ambulances. City parking system revamp was discussed which would include uniform parking fees city-wide.
 - -LANCC: Discussed the new financial system which goes into effect on December 12th.

 - i. **POLICY MOTION: CUP RENEWAL: 3455 OVERLAND AVE:** Motion to support the renewal of an existing Conditional Use Permit for beer and wine in conjunction with a restaurant and a Zone Variance to permit 10 of the 13 required parking spaces to be provided off-site by lease in lieu of by covenant for restaurant n/naka, an existing Japanese restaurant at 3455 Overland. Initial application for this CUP was approved by MVCC two years ago. Approved unanimously in committee
 - Dining at this restaurant is by reservation only [no walk ins]. The renewal contains no new or different requests from the original proposal approved by the MVCC Motion carries unanimously.

 - i. POLICY MOTION: BEES: COUNCIL FILE 13-0002-S134 [see City Clerk website http://cityclerk.lacity.org/lacityclerkconnect/ for Council motion]
 The Mar Vista Community Council supports the Los Angeles City Council's resolution supporting HR 2692, "Saving America's Pollinators Act of 2013."
 This resolution would include 'bees' as animals/insects residents can keep along with dogs and cats and outlaw pesticides that contribute to the demise of the bees. Motion carries unanimously.
 - ii. POLICY MOTION: GMO: COUNCIL MOTION 13-1374 [see City Clerk website http://cityclerk.lacity.org/lacityclerkconnect/ for Council motion]
 The Mar Vista Community Council supports the Los Angeles City Council's motion directing the City Attorney to prepare and present an ordinance which would prohibit the sale and growth of patented genetically modified (GM) crops within City limits, and recommends striking the phrase "the sale of any seeds that could potentially be contaminated by other genetically modified organisms (GMO)" from the last paragraph.
 Motion carries with 8 ayes, 1 nay, and 1 abstention (Mitchell Riche)
 - iii. POLICY MOTION: WATER FOUNTAINS: COUNCIL MOTION [see City Clerk website http://cityclerk.lacity.org/lacityclerkconnect/ for Council motion]
 Whereas it would greatly support the reuse of water bottles, reduce waste, provide better access to drinking water and have tremendous environmental benefits, the Mar Vista Community Council Motion strongly supports the following motion going before the LA City Council Energy and Environment Committee Motion by Councilmembers Tom LaBonge and Jose Huizar requesting the LADWP to work with organizations such as WeTap to report back on a comprehensive plan to upgrade, restore, and bring back public water fountains in public spaces in the City. MVCC requests that the fountains accommodate the refill of water bottles

and a process for reporting broken fountains. The Green Committee also requests that the board file a community impact report supporting the motion.

Motion carries unanimously.

iv. ADMINISTRATIVE MOTION: DIRECTORS REQUEST [MELISSA STOLLER]: 2014 GREEN GARDEN SHOWCASE [5 min] "Green Garden Showcase slated to be replaced with alternative local Earth Day events" Wording submitted by Melissa Stoller. The Green Committee has not yet considered this item as a motion in committee.

The Green Committee proposes celebrating Earth day on April 26th with a less structured community event focused on sustainability. Ideas include community green volunteering – perhaps at local schools, tree plantings, feathers, and fokiage walks, and construction of demonstration gardens. There could also be localized mini garden shows; anyone who wants could open their sustainable garden on their own as well. The Green Committee would organize some activities, be a catalyst and clearinghouse for others and, with MVCC, provide overall organization and publicity. We're open to ideas and would like feedback on this concept.

Green committee is thinking about creating a virtual Green Garden Showcase. They are also looking at continuing some of the peripheral sustainable living projects as small events.
