No one will be excluded simply because of the location of their residence lying outside of those boundaries.

  - c. Stakeholder Motion (Venice Blvd.) STATUS: Stakeholder Petition discussed at March 12 2019 Board of Directors meeting. Amended by Aaron Elster to read: Furthermore, the letter will withdraw the Mar Vista Community Council’s support for the Venice Blvd Great Streets Pilot Project. Status: The amendment was accepted and the amended motion passed at the 3.12.19 MVCC Board of Directors meeting.
