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- I. Englander Coyote Trap-Release proposal, CF 16-0585-S2
 - A. CLAW opposition. **Possible motion** for CIS in opposition

"MVCC opposes the proposal from Council Member Mitch Englander, CF 16-0585-S2, to reinstate a catch and release program for Coyotes in response to a recent biting incident on 3/14/17 in East LA.

A catch-and-release program for coyotes was <u>implemented in Los Angeles prior to 1994</u> and found wanting, as well as inoperable, and withdrawn in 1994. It is not necessary (or even now possible) to reiterate discarded solutions to a problem, no matter how urgent the issue.

MVCC shall submit a Community Impact Statement in opposition to this retrograde motion, even while working to pioneer a more effective response within our community. In cooperation with MVCC's Public Safety and Health Committee, the Parks and Open Space SubCommittee will initiate a public awareness campaign to raise consciousness of safe community practices in living among coyotes, including raising consciousness of the animals' biology and behaviours, and place within the ecosystem, and the practice of "hazing" favored by the animal control departments of Santa Monica, Culver City and Los Angeles County, and the Santa Monica Conservancy."
