Informative On MVCC CIS Regarding Clean Energy

At April's MVCC BOD meeting Ken, the co-chair of Infrastructure, affirms (via email) the following resolution was passed. There was some word-smithing at the meeting and I don't actually agree this was the final resolution, but I don't yet have the minutes; regardless there is more to add so it doesn't much matter; we can fiddle it all at once:

1) The Mar Vista Community Council resolves to call on Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti, the Los Angeles City Council, and the LADWP to study with a goal of 100% clean energy by 2030 scenario that excludes methane, biomass, coal, biogas, nuclear energy, or unbundled Renewable Energy Credits.

The Mar Vista Community Council resolves to submit a Community Impact Statement to Council File 16-0243 and to communicate support to our City Councilmembers expressing support for this position.

The Mar Vista Community Council resolves to submit a Community Impact Statement to the LADWP to communicate support for this position.

2) The Mar Vista Community Council should file a Community Impact Statement as follows:

"The Mar Vista Community Council supports the motion in Council File 18-0247, and calls on the LADWP to include a 10% renewable energy case in all future annual Power Integrated Resource Plans, to switch its Green Power offering from biomass to solar and wind power."

Issues.

- <u>CF 16-0243</u> is all about studying 100% renewable energy and has a final Council action from six months ago with no plans to bring anything new to it; it will have been implemented or been in the works already, and our action here is superficial. Not unimportant but not happening now. Mid-City NC has recently filed a CIS so someone is intending to store information of some value there.
- But it turns out <u>CF 18-0247</u> is the Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) that is pending in Committee. There are some CIS there already and that is where we need to file.
- Consequently I suggest the following slight revisions that fixes errors in grammar, logic and target:

The Mar Vista Community Council (MVCC) resolves to call on Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti, the Los Angeles City Council, and the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) to study a scenario of 100% clean electricity by 2030 that excludes use of coal, methane, bio-mass, bio-gas, new nuclear facilities, and unbundled renewable energy credits. The MVCC calls for such a scenario to be included in all future annual Power Integrated Resource Plans.

The MVCC resolves to express this position via three community impact statements submitted to (1) LADWP, (2) CF 16-0243 and (3) CF 18-0247.
