4) Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant.

826LA's mission is to support students ages 6-18 with their creative and expository writing skills and to help teachers inspire their students to write. Our services are structured around the understanding that great leaps in learning can happen with one-on-one attention, and that strong writing skills are fundamental to future success.

All of 826LA's programs are free of charge, and we have served students on the westside of LA from our center in Mar Vista since 2012. Previously, they had been held out of the SPARC building just down Venice Boulevard since 2005. All of 826LA's programs are supported by community volunteers-- last year, 1,166 volunteers donated over 22,000 hours of their time.

826LA offers one-on-one homework from trained volunteers, as well as workshops by local artists ranging from puppetry to songwriting. Additionally, 826LA's field trip program gets local students excited about writing by guiding them in writing a collaborative book as a classroom—in three hours! The In-Schools team brings the 826LA ethos into high schools, including Venice High School, where dedicated 826LA volunteers are available to students who want extra help with their creative writing, college essays, and scholarship applications.

826LA staff and volunteers are working to make sure that all of these vital programs remain available to the students of Los Angeles. Our team has created a Virtual Hub (826LA.org/virtual) with writing prompts and video workshops that students can do on their own; online programs started this week; and 826LA's case management of families continues, with over 300 students served since Safer-At-Home began.

5) How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at-large. (Grants cannot be used as rewards or prizes for individuals)

A grant from the Mar Vista Community Council would support the work of the tutoring and workshop programs. The majority of Mar Vista tutoring program students are Mar Vista residents, and 826LA's workshops are open to the public (and attended by many Mar Vista students, as well).

On May 4, 826LA began virtual tutoring and workshops. 826LA volunteers will provide one-on-one tutoring and homework help twice a day, four days a week, with up to 10 students in each session. 826LA has had over 170 volunteers commit to volunteering online, and we are working to ensure that they have the support they need to participate remotely, including specialized training for senior volunteers who might not be familiar with web-based conferencing platforms.

This grant will also support the work of case management and care packages for our Mar Vista families. 826LA has begun to distribute care packages to students and their families from our Mar Vista center. The care packages include books, worksheets, and creative materials such as notebooks, pens and pencils, markers, colored pencils, index cards, glue sticks, scissors, and pencil pouches.
