Summary: The MVCC is against this motion unless amended to address the following considerations when drafting and considering the motions in Council File 22-0158 by the City Council, Los Angeles City Planning, and City Attorney: – Automatically including LAMC (Los Angeles Municipal Code) 41.18 protections on any location providing a homeless shelter and authorized pursuant to a declared shelter crisis or emergency. – Mandatory CEQA (California Environmental Quality Act) compliance (i.e., among other things, to inform decision makers and the public about the potential environmental impacts of proposed projects, and to reduce those environmental impacts to the extent feasible.). – Consequences of “cutting red tape” by removing the public’s right to a transparent approval process including right to notification and the opportunity for public comment, including early notification to NCs and recognized CCs. – The differences and effects of allowing shelters in R1 zones as proposed versus the existing ordinances allowing them in R2 & R3 zones. – The effects of limiting shelters within a reasonable radius of sensitive sites such as parks, schools, libraries and daycares.
