1. CALL TO ORDER - 6:02pm

2. ROLL CALL AND EX-PARTE COMMUNICATIONS/CONFLICTS-OF-INTEREST - Roll Call shall include each attending board members declaring any ex parte communications outside of their duties and conflicts of interest pertaining to items on or related to this agenda. - Committee Chair Paul present, no ex parte, no conflict. Vice Chair Myhra present, no ex parte, no conflict. Director Rafeedie, no ex parte, no conflict.

3. Welcome and Announcements -

- Pamela Lee, Supervising Transportation Planner II from LADOT followed up with Director Paul and provided a spreadsheet of every instance of LADOT outreach on the Venice Blvd Safety and Mobility Plan. Director Paul is going to put it up on the website.
- Update on our motion for a crosswalk on Beethoven St between 3428 and 3436. Director Paul followed up regarding the motion with Ashley Lozada the Venice, Mar Vista, Del Rey Field Deputy for CD 11. She explained the street is too narrow as it is a collector street which means it is a low to moderate capacity road which serves to move traffic from local streets to arterial roads. This disqualified it from getting a crosswalk. It also does not meet the department's minimum requirements for making a crosswalk. There are no ADA ramps or street lighting.
- 4. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES
 - 4.1. FEBRUARY 1, 2023 -
 - Public comment: A stakeholder states that these minutes are better than most but they are trying to get BONC to start requiring more in depth meeting minutes. They wanted to voice their opinion that meeting minutes are a public record and they have become too light. They stated that MVCC once paid a professional to take minutes.
 - Moved by Director Paul, seconded by Director Myhra. Passed with no objection.

5. CHAIR REPORTS

- Chair Jordan Paul None to add
- Vice-Chair Faith Myhra There will be a compositing service coming to LA through the LA Sanitation department based on state legislation. Director Myhra is working with LA Sanitation to get them to come to our committee to present so they can talk to us about what that looks like for homeowners, for renters, and for businesses. We will hopefully have that at the next meeting.
- WRAC Report Andy Perrine Much of the last WRAC meeting was spent with the new council members

representatives for transit in CD 5 and CD 11.

- They went through previous service requests and it is suggested that people follow up on those requests with the new offices as the council offices don't seem to have robust transition procedures in place. (Director Paul mentioned since this MVCC term will be up in June we should make a transition memo so that the new board is up to date.)
- Additionally the WRAC meeting discussed electric scooters and if people see them blocking sidewalks to report them through the 311 app. In part because every time that happens the scooter companies get a fine that goes back to city revenue for other useful city services.
- Another big topic was Metro. It looks like Metro will be at the next WRAC Mobility & Transportation Committee to talk about Sepulveda Transit Corridor project updates. They will also talk about the budget because there is a short fall and there are worries there will be service cuts.
- A motion passed that asks the city controller to audit the STAP program (advertising project about bus shelters) There were serious sounding financial concerns around the project, one that affects us as part of Mar Vista is in CD5. Though this project was rolled out with an equity lens and intended to be equal across the council districts, it ended up that 3-5x as many bus stop covers were in CD5 where there are relatively more affluent riders as compared to South LA. (Director Paul is going to put the new CD5 and CD11 reps on transitions name on the website.)
- 6. PUBLIC COMMENTS FOR ITEMS NOT ON THIS AGENDA The Brown Act provides for a "part of the meeting where the public can comment on any item of interest that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the local agency." The MVCC is an advisory board to the Los Angeles City council and, as such, its jurisdiction is restricted within Los Angeles and most importantly, the Mar Vista Community. Therefore, please keep public comments within the MVCC jurisdiction. Thank you.
 - In regards to the update on the Beethoven St crosswalk, one stakeholder suggests that we have the rep come to our meeting to talk with us about what motion we should be putting forward that would address the safety concerns at that crossing.
 - Director Paul thinks it is a good point. Maybe we should push the issue of why it is a place where there will never be a crosswalk given the idea is well supported in the area.
 - Stakeholder hopes that we can support our restaurants with alfresco dining. They cannot see why our city is trying to force ordinances on alfresco dining. They state they are not opposed to the Venice Blvd Safety and Mobility project; they just don't feel that it was properly planned. Want to consider registration for e-mobility items.
 - Stakeholder wants people to wear helmets while on e-bikes.
 - Stakeholder suggest this committee, or the next elected, keep a running document of any issues that we have, for instance: places we want stop signs, fixed side walks, crosswalks, etc.

7. SPECIAL ORDERS

7.1. [POLICY] WASATCH AVENUE RESURFACING. Discussion and possible action to add Wasatch Avenue to the next street resurfacing schedule. Amendment to motion moved by Myhra, seconded by Paul, approved 6 to 0, with 0 abstention. Amended motion moved by Director Paul, seconded by Director Myhra, motion approved 6 to 0, with 0 abstention.
