

RE: Parking at EV flo Charging Stations in Mar Vista

As electric vehicles become increasingly common, there has been an urgency to increase the number of charging stations in Los Angeles. These charging stations are administered by a number of private and public entities. <u>LALights, or the Bureau of Street Lights within the Department of Water and Power, administers the flo EV charging stations. These are innovative curbside stations that attach to a streetlight and utilize existing circuitry.</u>

The map below, from LALights, shows the three flo stations in Mar Vista Zone 1:



However, as brought to our attention by community member Solomon Russell, some of these stations are underutilized. He has submitted a 311 request with Request Number XXXXX. This is primarily because non-EVs often occupy the spots; there is no signage or enforcement designating these for the exclusive use of EVs. It would be helpful for EV charging stations to have policies and signage encouraging their use by EVs and preventing non-EVs from monopolizing their use.

We request that LALights and the LADOT Parking Enforcement Division research this issue and consider how to increase access to and utilization of these charging stations with signage and/or curb markings.
