IN CONFORMITY WITH THE OCTOBER 6, 2023 ENACTMENT OF CALIFORNIA SENATE BILL 411 (PORTANTINO) AND LA CITY COUNCIL APPROVAL ON NOVEMBER 1, 2023 THE MAR VISTA COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING WILL BE CONDUCTED VIRTUALLY.

Every person wishing to address the Board must dia (669) 900-6333, and enter 846 6660 9891 and then press # to join the meeting. When prompted by the presiding officer, to provide public input at the Neighborhood Council meeting the public will be requested to dial *9 or use the Raise Hand option, to address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered.

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to 1 minute per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.

Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.

(i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph, to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.

(ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.

(iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to one minute per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

- 3. WELCOME, ANNOUNCEMENTS and COMMUNITY MEMORIALS Martin Rubin, current NC board member
- 4. ELECTED REPRESENTATIVE, GOVERNMENT AGENCY AND CITY DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Summary of Matt's Comments (Council District 11 – Traci Park's Office):

Tribute to Martin:

- Matt and Councilwoman Park spent time with Martin three weeks before his passing.
- Described Martin as a friend, deeply committed to his community.
- Emphasized Martin's legacy of selfless service.
- Encouraged attendance at the **Council meeting honoring Martin** (via adjournment motion); offered help with parking arrangements.

Constituent Updates & Government Affairs:

- 1. Beethoven Market:
 - Ongoing community complaints about cove violations.
 - Building & Safety issued compliance orders (expired June 11); a reinspection is pending.
 - Matt is pushing for follow-up and will host a community update call. Residents interested in joining should email him.

2. Homelessness & Vacant Properties

- Venice Blvd Vacant Lots (between Sawtelle & Butler):
 - Trespassing has occurred on fenced lots after a previous encampment operation.
 - New violations issued; city awaiting compliance or enforcement.
 - Matt following up as deadlines approach in July.
- Meyer Street Encampment (near Blue Oak Preschool):
 - Concerns due to proximity to children.
 - The property has a **demolition permit (from Nov)** but is awaiting a **pre-demolition inspection** before action can proceed.
 - City is attempting to reach the owner; progress is slow.

3. Immigration Enforcement Concerns:

- Recent ICE activity has caused fear in immigrant communities.
 - People are avoiding public places and essential services.
- City of LA is a sanctuary city (codified Jan last year):
 - No city resources/personnel assist federal immigration enforcement.
- Matt's office offers:
 - Multilingual know-your-rights flyers, "red cards", and referrals to legal/medical/food services via nonprofit partners.
- Reassured residents: "You're not alone. We are here to support you."

Summary of Prabjot Chambers' Comments (EmpwerLA):

• Honoring Martin:

Prabjot acknowledged Martin's kindness and generosity. Withough she didn't work closely with him, others in the department did. EmpowerLA would like to highlight Martin's contributions on social media and will coordinate with Carolyn to make that happen.

• Neighborhood Council Year-End Review (Due July 31):

EmpowerLA is requesting all Neighborhood Councils complete a self-assessment by Thursday, July 31.

- It's a short, informal survey reflecting on accomplishments and areas for growth.
- Councils can either agendize the item for an upcoming board meeting or have an executive officer complete it on the board's behalf.
- Questions can be directed to Prabjot.

Post-Election Feedback Initiative:

With the recent Neighborhood Council elections concluded, EmpowerLA will soon be reaching out to gather feedback on:

- What outreach strategies were effective
- What needs improvement
- Insights will be shared with city partners like the City Clerk's Elections Division to enhance future election cycles.

• Election Metrics:

EmpowerLA is developing data reports by region, including metrics like outreach events, ballot counts, and voter turnout.

• The goal is to create a more data-driven approach for planning and improvement.

• Department Restructuring – NEA Assignments:

- EmpowerLA is shifting to a regional model: each NEA will now oversee a designated region rather than individual councils.
- This change takes effect next month.
- Prabjot will no longer be the NEA for Mar Vista, but a new representative will be introduced soon as part of the transition.

Summary of Katie Abrams' Comments (Supervisor Horvath's):

Katie Abrams introduced herself as a new field deputy for Supervisor Horvath's office and expressed her intention to become a regular presence at MVCC meetings. She shared a few updates:

- Supervisor Horvath attended the LA County Water Resiliency Summit, focusing on climate-resilient infrastructure.
- She also joined the Blue Ribbon Commission and UCLA for the release of wildfire recovery recommendations, including a proposal to create a Resilient Rebuilding Authority.
- Metro released the Draft Environmental Impact Report for the Sepulveda Transit Corridor. Although it may not directly affect Mar Vista, Katie encouraged community feedback on the proposed alternatives. Metro is bosting public meetings through August 30.

Katie provided her contact info (kebrame@bos lacounty.gov) and welcomed further engagement from board and community members.

Summary of Karen Calderón's Comments (Isaac Bryan's Office):

Introduction:

Karen Calderón is the new Senior Field Representative for Assemblymember Isaac Bryan, joining the team in April. She's replacing Michelle, who was promoted to District Director.

- Legislative Updates:
 - House of Origin Week:

16 of Assemblymember Bryan's bills successfully passed this key legislative milestone.

• Key Bills:

AB 246 – Social Security Tenant Protections Act

Nicknamed the *"Do Not Evict My Grandmother Act"*, this bill protects seniors and disabled Social Security recipients from eviction due to delayed benefit payments.

■ AB 247 – Incarcerated Firefighter Wages

Raises minimum wage for incarcerated firefighters to **\$7.25/hour** (up from roughly **\$1/hour or less**). Passed with strong bipartisan support (74 out of 80 votes).

AB 248 – Jail Wage Cap Removal

Removes the **\$2/day cap** for inmates in county and local jails, allowing counties to set fairer wages. This bill gives counties discretion to adjust compensation for inmate labor without additional state costs.

• Community Engagement:

- A town hall is planned for later this year (date TBD).
- A job fair is being planned for early August in partnership with West LA College.
- The office will participate in:
 - LA84 Play Day (West Adams)
 - Mid City Arts and Music Festival

• Closing:

Karen encouraged community members to attend upcoming events and reach out with questions or interest in learning more about the legislative package.

6. SPECIAL ORDERS

6.1. PUBLIC COMMENTS FOR ITEMS NOT ON THIS AGENDA - 1 minute per speaker, if time permits, more time will be given. The MVCC is built on Stakeholder participation and input; especially through our committees (see MarVista.org > Council > Committees). The Brown Act provides for a "part of the meeting where the public can comment on any item of interest that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the local agerdy." The MVCC is an advisory board to the Los Angeles City Council and, as such, its jurisdiction is restricted within Los Angeles and most importantly, the Mar Vista Community. Therefore, please keep public comments within the MVCC jurisdiction and on matters that the MVCC may act upon in future meetings. Thank you for your involvement with the MVCC. Summary of Public Comment (Tommy):

- In November 2024, the MVCC approved a \$2,800 Neighborhood Purpose Grant (NPG) for Karmic Action, which was supposed to fund a bike giveaway (including U-locks, lights, and helmets).
- Tommy went to the affiliated bike shop (Bici Libre in MacArthur Park) expecting a free U-lock but was told they were out and encouraged to donate instead.
- He expressed confusion and concern after researching Karmic Action online, noting:
 - No mention of Mar Vista on their site.
 - Karmic Action appears to be a fundraising affiliate, not a standalone community

program.

- Tommy questioned whether the grant money was spent as promised and urged the next board to investigate and verify deliverables.
- He suggested the board seek proof of how the funds were used and consider recovering the money if misused.

Summary of Public Comment (Ms. Winnington):

• Criticism of Board Oversight:

Echoed concerns about the **Karmic Action grant**, calling it "shady" and suggesting the board was **duped**.

Urged board members—especially newer ones—to **take more responsibility in managing taxpayer funds** and learn from the mistake.

• Middle East Conflict Warning:

Shifted to a geopolitical topic, cautioning against **another war in the Middle East**. Referenced historic false claims leading to war (e.g., **Iracis WMDs**), and criticized long-standing rhetoric from **Netanyahu** about puclear threats from Iran.

Mandating Homelessness Treatment:

Cited a **recent Santa Monica showing involving** a homeless individual, including an injured police officer.

Argued that **voluntary treatment isn't realistic** for those with mental health or substance abuse issues and called for **manuatory treatment policies**.
