Meetings regarding the Sepulveda Transit Corridor project were indefinitely postponed.

WRAC discussed bus lane violations, digital billboards, and the HLA council file. There was a discussion and motion regarding banning ebikes on sidewalks.

NCSA energy committee meeting included an update on the Angeles Link project by SoCal gas to create a hydrogen distribution system. The Sierra Club has now officially come out against it. LA NCSA has links about phase II of the project. The alliance is still working on pressuring the council to remediate oil wells in residential areas. NCSA is doing a free screening of Join or Die on April 11.

- 8. STANDARD ORDER OF BUSINESS NEW SEE SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS FOR DETAILS
 - 8.1. [POLICY] (Oil Well Acid Maintenance / Public Notification / Discretionary Review / AB3233 / Interim Control Ordinance) Discussion and possible action regarding Council File 24-1580 on the use of maintenance acidizing at local oil sites, brought to our committee by a constituent.

Fred: This motion, filed 12/13/2024, is part of the effort to limit and make sure that oil and gas drilling sites within the city are safe. Sometimes, drillers inject chemicals into the ground to get additional oil and gas flowing. These acids are extremely toxic and harmful to the nearby residents.

The motion has the following action items:

- 1. the City Council INSTRUCT the Department of City Planning, with the assistance of the Los Angeles Fire Department, the Petroleum Administrator, and the City Attorney to prepare and present an interim control ordinance that would halt the practice of oil well acid maintenance.
- 2. the City Council INSTRUCT the Department of City Planning report back with a timeline on when a new oil ordinance will be completed under the City's authority affirmed by AB 3233 and a timeline for a new Zoning Administrator Interpretation for well maintenance projects that would significantly expand public notification requirements and provide for discretionary review of such projects.

While AB 3233 has gone into effect already, we still need a plan and timeline for a new ordinance since the last one was invalidated.

April: Fracking is the initial drilling process. Chemical injection is separate, to lubricate the hole to allow oil flow.

8.2. **[POLICY] (Sawtelle Traffic and Safety Request)** Discussion and possible action regarding a letter on the traffic and safety concerns along Sawtelle, brought to our committee by a constituent.

Kelsey: Pushing vote until next time, stakeholder was not able to be present.

8.3. [POLICY] (Underground and Aboveground Utilities / Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zones / Powerline Undergrounding / 2025 Windstorm and Wildfire Recovery) Discussion and possible action regarding Council File 25-0006-S28 on the prioritization of burying power lines in very high fire hazard severity zones.

Fred: This motion was filed January 14 of this year. It would force more powerlines underground in areas exposed to high winds. This would reduce the risk of future fires.

The motion has the following action items:

- 1. that the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power be INSTRUCTED to report back with a current map of all undergrounded and aboveground utilities in Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zones
- 2. that the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power, with the assistance of any needed department or government agency, be INSTRUCTED to report back on the feasibility and implementation of a tiered system for undergrounding powerlines.

Kelsey: Given the fires and how ugly aboveground powerlines are, this seems like a great idea and hugely important for this region.



8.4. [POLICY] (Ocean Water Quality / Public Safety and Health / Marine Life / Beaches / Hazardous Debris / Palisades Fire / 2025 Windstorm and Wildfire Recovery) Discussion and possible action regarding Council File 25-0006-S69 on ocean water quality conditions post-wildfire.

April: This council file passed! Unclear on the timeline for how quickly it will go into effect. Kelsey: Stay out of the water, it is quite toxic right now.

8.5. [POLICY] (Lackluster bike parking at Venice and Centinela) Discussion and possible action regarding bike parking at the NE corner of Venice and Centinela, brought to our committee by a constituent.

Cian: Not sure who the landowner is or who can be contacted about adding more bike parking. 311 does not have a place to request bike parking. Ideally, this parking would not be on the street but in the parking lot itself, which is under private ownership.

April: Metro bike installations should include regular bike parking as well. We have the ability to recommend things to metro. It is tougher to force private property to do things.

IN CONFORMITY WITH THE OCTOBER 6, 2023 ENACTMENT OF CALIFORNIA SENATE BILL 411 (PORTANTINO) AND LA CITY COUNCIL APPROVAL ON NOVEMBER 1, 2023, THE MAR VISTA COMMUNITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE MEETING WILL BE CONDUCTED VIRTUALLY.

SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.

- (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph, to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.
- (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.
- (iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.
