Comparing the 2025 crimes in the Mar Vista Community Council area to the 2024 crimes, there has been a 20% decrease across the board (with the exception rape crimes).

With **burglaries** being a primary issue in the MVCC area, there were 180 reported burglaries in 2025, which was 41 less than 2024. These burglaries included residential burglaries, business burglaries, garage burglaries, and apartment complex lobbies, and apartment complex secured parking garage storage areas. This is also a significant decrease from the 300 burglaries in 2023, the peak of the burglary problem, which was also citywide.

Thefts from vehicles has also been a problem, especially with catalytic converters thefts. Though it is still a problem, there has been a decrease for the past four years (271 in 2025, 348 in 2024, 398 in 2023, and 485 in 2022.) 71 catalytic converter thefts were reported in 2025, a 26% decrease compared to the 96 in 2024. 291 occurred in 2023.

As far as **Grand Theft Autos (Stolen Vehicles)**, looking at the long-term range, from the four years 2021 to 2024, the MVCC area averaged 230 to 245 stolen vehicles per year. In 2025, there was 171, the first time it was less than 230 in years and 26% less than 2024.
