1. HISTORY OF MAR VISTA AND DCRC

The Disability Community Resource Center (at the NW corner of Beethoven and Venice) is jointly owned by the city and the DCRC itself. The city is asking for federal funds (Housing & Urban Development, or HUD) to demolish it.

Asking HUD for funds automatically triggers a review of the property to see if it deserves National Historic Registry status. The city hired a firm (ICF) to investigate, and ICF reached out to a number of other partners for more information about the site, and the MVCC was one of those consulting partners.

ICF concludes that the property is **not** worthy of national historic status.

The final report is in the supporting documents for this board meeting.

2. SELF-GUIDED TOUR MAP OF VENICE BLVD MURALS AVAILABLE

A map of over 20 artist murals and other art along Venice Blvd between Wade Street and Inglewood Boulevard is free on the MVCC website as PDFs, either one viewable on a mobile device or printed (double sided) and folded as a brochure. The map contains a brief history of Mar Vista and information (where available) about the murals from the artist themselves. This map features art in zones 4, 5, 6 and 7 of the Mar Vista Neighborhood Council.

3. WARREN AVENUE ROAD REPAIR CONTINUES

After a multi-month delay, the City has returned to repairing the severely damaged road on Warren Avenue on Monday September 14. By Tuesday September 15, the worst of the damage was repaired, but there is still more to repair.

Residents were given notice of the parking restrictions.
