EV Charger Rebates

The most popular choices for charging EVs at home are to plug into a standard outlet or install a Level 2 charger (for faster charging). LADWP offers a great rebate toward the purchase of a Level 2 home EV charger. Installation costs are not included. LADWP also offers rebates for EV chargers installed by

commercial customers (including multi-unit dwellings). LADWP's goal is to encourage the widespread installation of EV charging stations throughout LA.
